

## Sports Premium Funding

2018 – 2019

This academic year Woodcroft Primary School will receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil. The total is £17760.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport you offer.

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Employment of Havant Academy – Wednesday afternoons to work alongside teachers to deliver various sports activities.	£4000	To up skill the teaching of games across the Year groups. Allow teachers to benefit from working with specialists.	Coach has excellent rapport with teachers and pupils. This has exposed teachers and pupils to different sports, however this needs to be mapped out more specifically in the future to ensure that broader coverage is delivered. After school change linked to sports lessons.
Subsidise an after school club ran by Havant and Waterlooville FC.	£1020	By subsidising the cost of this club it allows for more of our children to attend and reduces the financial impact on our families.	Approximately 8 to 10 children attend this club each week. These numbers are low, but consistent. Further Year Groups need to be encouraged to attend. Pupils attended tournament which they would not have done without this.
Employment of CFC for Monday lunchtime and afternoon to deliver a programme of multi-sports that changes each half-term.	£2775	The aim of this is to offer 6 different sports throughout the year to our children and broaden their experiences. The afterschool clubs will change half-termly in-line with what lessons are being delivered during class time.	Coach has good rapport with teachers and pupils. Sports change each half term. Sports leader directs which sports to teach as part of PE curriculum. Teachers are involved in lessons.
Employment of a Rugby coach on a Thursday morning	£4440	Nigel Phillips is a qualified coach linked with Havant & Waterlooville Rugby Club and Harlequins. Each Thursday he runs 3 sessions that rotate across Year 1 to 6. These intensive sessions build the children's stamina and provide a different sport for them to experience.	This exposed children to rugby skills for the year. Younger Year groups benefitted less from the sessions in terms of specific skills. This will not be repeated next year as we are going to focus on resilience building through different activities.
Additional swimming lessons for Years 4 and 5.	£2026.80	These additional lessons are to help prepare children for achieving end of Year 6 target in swimming. More importantly swimming is an	Successful. Feedback from teachers and coaches showed that children progressed through these sessions. Preparing children for Year 6

Additional PE kit and a team Kit for the school	£500	Children frequently forget kit for PE and this hinders their ability to take part. If each Year group has spare kit then this allows more children to be active in lessons. The school needs a recognisable kit for matches and allow the children to take pride in their sporting endeavours.	Sports kit was borrowed for tournament. This still needs to be purchased but local sponsor being sought. Spare PE kit now in school although this is predominately for internal PE. Overtops needed for outdoor PE.
Additional playground equipment	£1500	Opportunities for children to develop different skills that will support their physical development through additional playground equipment. This is targeted at KS1 and includes painting aspects of the playground that will benefit current and future cohorts.	Wheelie trays, pogo sticks, balls, stand up steppers, tennis rackets, hula hoops, 2 x music boxes purchased.  Lunchtime Staff were also provided additional training by Sports coach on games they can play at lunchtime.
Stadium and sporting event visits and prominent visitors.	£1500	Organised trips to inspire the children to sports events that will interest and engage the children – e.g. the para Olympic sports activities at the Intech Centre.  This will also support funding inspirational visitors into school e.g. the Olympian programme.	Some trips included Portsmouth Gymnasium centre, Power boating in Portsmouth, Rock climbing and Football tournament costs. This needs further development for next year as an Olympic Year.
