

## Sports Premium Funding

Employment of Havant Academy – Wednesday afternoons to work alongside teachers to deliver various sports activities.	£4000	To up skill the teaching of games across the Year groups. Allow teachers to benefit from working with specialists. Different sports mapped out with PE lead to ensure varied coverage.	This ceased on the 20.3.20 due to Covid. Prior to this all sessions mapped out by PE co-ordinator and then coaches informed of the skills that needed to be delivered. Children responded positively to the coaching and teachers reported that very useful sessions. Recommended that this is extended into 20/21
Subsidise an after school club ran by Havant and Waterlooville FC.	£1020	By subsidising the cost of this club it allows for more of our children to attend and reduces the financial impact on our families. This needs to encourage younger children to attend in order to build numbers.	Approximately 10 children attended this club on a regular basis. We then entered a team into a football tournament that Havant & Waterlooville organised. Positive experience for those children involved. Ceased on 20.3.20 due to Covid-19 restrictions.
Employment of CFC for Monday lunchtime and afternoon to deliver a programme of multi-sports that changes each half-term.	£2775	The aim of this is to offer 6 different sports throughout the year to our children and broaden their experiences. The afterschool clubs will change half-termly in-line with what lessons are being delivered during class time.	This ceased on the 20.3.20 due to Covid. Prior to this all sessions mapped out by PE co-ordinator and then coaches informed of the skills that needed to be delivered. Children responded positively to the coaching and teachers reported that very useful sessions. This complimented the coach from Havant Academy. Recommended that this is extended into 20/21.
Additional swimming lessons for Years 4 and 5.	£2026.80	These additional lessons are to help prepare children for achieving end of Year 6 target in swimming. More importantly swimming is an essential skill that all children should have the opportunity to learn. (Year 6 lessons are funded from the curriculum budget)	These never occurred as were scheduled for Summer term 2020 and due to Covid were cancelled.  Recommended that additional swimming be offered next year.

Additional Coach to provide resilience lessons alongside the teacher.	Estimated £3000	After the collapse of The Prince William Award, alternative options required to deliver resilience lessons. Coach employed to deliver whole class Karate lessons, orienteering and team building activities. Aimed initially at Years 5 and 6.	Unfortunately we were unable to employ a suitable individual who could offer this support.
Olympic Activities	£2000	This is an Olympic Year and the whole school is doing this as a topic. Activities still being arranged but may include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Whole school trip to Olympic park in London.</li> <li>• Visit by an Olympian</li> <li>• Cross school Olympics</li> </ul>	These were planned for the Summer term but had to be cancelled due to the impact of Covid.
Playground equipment	£1000	Review of lunchtime equipment. This needs updating every year. Alternative sports equipment for lunch time to support different development of skills rather than just football. Giant chess, scooters, pogo sticks, skipping ropes, wheelie trays and go-karts. (Fixed equipment to be updated through capital.	Additional wheelie trays, skipping ropes, balls and stilts were purchased.  This equipment needs to be updated yearly.
PE Kit in School	£500	This needs to focus on providing outdoor kit for children to ensure that they do not miss out on sports through the Winter. Team sports kit supplemented through local sponsorship.	Spare sports kit has been purchased for in school use. Sports kit sponsors are being sort in order to provide additional financial aid for a school sports kit.
